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
Participatingin various singing competitions

BPM: Have you always wanted a career as an artist or was it unexpected?

Raffaella: Since childhood I demonstrated a strong interest and aptitude for art activities, choosing as a didactic tool the drums and then I've chosen my voice as principal instrument, the modern singing. Sincerely when you know the artistic side inside oneself, since childhood you want to achieve own dreams working with own greatest passion ... No, I always thought to realize something with music sooner or later constantly in the time.

BPM: At the peak of your career who would you aspire to be as successful as?

Raffaella: Simply I hope to continue in this way with many collaborations with other artists, working on interesting music projects and to continue to express my artistry with my voice.

BPM: Where do you picture yourself in three years?

Raffaella: oh ... I'd like to know it! I think I'll continue in this way, in my studio for recording, mixing, creating new interesting songs. A constant comparison with new artists from all over the world and with new music styles.

BPM: If you could win any award, what award would it be, and why?

Raffaella: Academy Award! No, I'm joking ... When I work with music I don't think to awards, my only satisfaction is to do good jobs obtaining good feedback. Awards are only the confirmation of the approval of the public. If I'll win them I'll be very happy ,,, as The Akademia Music Award for Best Pop Rock EP for my EP "Fragments Of My Dream" received in the August 2015.

BPM: What would be your dream collaboration and why?

Raffaella: Oh they are really a lot, too much to list. I mention some names that I consider sacred voices with which I'd like to confront myself. Aida Cooper, Michael Kiske, Sebastian Bach, Alicia Keys, Christina Aguilera ... I like to dream!

BPM: What's the craziest thing a fans done for you?

Raffaella: Nothing, I like to have a normal relationship with my fans

BPM: Whilst were on the subject on fans what is the most random thing a fan has said to you?

Raffaella: Until now I have only received compliments and intelligent criticisms to improve myself in the music, I'm not complaining.

Raffaella: The passion for the music is the engine of all, when you give up support for music you receive it also ... I think that to want to do things rightly and correctly, without burning the steps, is the key to winning with the music

BPM: Your fave song on iTunes charts right now?

Raffaella: I like Adele very much, as voice, passion... all, for me she's a very great artist.

BPM: What has been your most awesome moment in the music industry so far?

Raffaella: I've received the invitation (April 21, 2016) for the Akademia Gala Event in Los Angeles - California for the award received last August for my EP Fragments Of My Dream. This is for me a beautiful confirmation in the music.

BPM: What can we expect from you in 2016?

Raffaella: Some achievements are already came for me this year, in this period I'm writing many new lyrics for other independent artists. My official website is always updated for my music, my international radio broadcast, my new music works etc. Stay tuned!

BPM: What's the best advice you recommend for new artists?



JJ: That's an easy question, I am 50, this year, and I plan to tour in 2016/17, and retire to my base in Tenerife, with the Wife (Corinne), and maybe do a couple of gig's a year to keep the hand in.

BPM: If you could win any award, what award would it be, and why?

JJ: Best Radio show/Podcast! it's the Show and Podcasts which keep the people in touch between gig's, and radio show's.. I have a Mix show, which has proved to be a success, No chat, No Playlist, I go in and do an off the cuff LIVE mix for 2hrs, no gimmicks, effect's, just a few jingles. and to be rewarded for doing a no chat radio show, would be a massive reward for me, and Soulbeat Radio, who were brave enough to take the show concept on board.

BPM: What would be your dream show?

JJ: I do it now

BPM: What's the craziest thing a fans done for you?

JJ: I get asked to do a lot of after-parties, and have been to exotic places for celebrity parties.. Nuff said?

BPM: Whilst were on the subject on fans what is the most random thing a fan has said to you?

I have a fan from France, who has travel to at least 16 counties to attend gig's.. and I won't mention His! name..

JJ: As I have previously stated, I am coming to my 50th year, in age, and feel that I have worked a lot in radio, from Pirate to stint's on Local, and now internet radio, which is clearly the way forward, and so if I haven't presented it yet.. it's on it's way.. watch this space.

BPM: Have you got your eye on any upcoming stars for us to look out for?

Music is changing, and I would say it's more production teams/Labels which are carrying the swing, but the UK has some great Labels, and is well represented in the House/Nu-Disco Markets, so I have plenty of quality product.

BPM: Who is your biggest inspiration in life, what inspires you about them?

JJ: The only man I have ever looked up to is my father, he gave all, and asked for little in return. I look to his lessons, to make me a better man.. Still learning.

BPM: What's your fave song playlist right now?

It may be a little left field, but I think Ghostdancer - Ashley Beedle is going to be a Massive Dance floor track this Summer.

BPM: What has been your most awesome moment in the music industry?

BPM: What can we expect from you in 2016?


Mark: If it all goes to plan I will be heading out to DJ at Spring Break Island Festival and Ultra Europe!

This is what I have learned, and keep learning... This grain of sand is me.




I could never learn anymore than that because of the vastness of the Creator. (Represented in the sandy beach and ocean.) And why would I want to. But here is where it gets good.

Perfection... What does that mean?

Well for me it meant doing not just the best I can but having it done without any mistakes. From my ego's perspective, I thought that if I did everything perfectly, then I would reach enlightenment.

If I made an error, which happened all the time (still does, of course) then I was really hard on myself. The phrase "Stupid me" would be touted around in my head, sometimes for days.

I have since come to realize that it's okay to make the miscalculations. In fact, it is what helps to show our uniqueness. In addition, the path to Enlightenment is found in other ways.

More over this is not what the Creator sees. Because in the Divine's eyes we are already perfect. We just can't see it. When you put all of us together, you can feel the flawlessness. The smooth, soft warm sensation as each grain of sand flows through your toes.

It also shows that there is no way we could ever learn anymore than a "grain of sand". It becomes impossible, no matter how much we know.

Plus, the grain is unequaled. No one grain of sand is the same. Everyone is different. The same can be said about us.

The lesson also continues to teach me about being humble. (In the spiritual sense.)

For me, I am learning this lesson on two fronts. First, is the release of the ego mind. Learning simply not to become caught up in the fear of it all. Instead I am learning to become detached. This allows me to accept situations at face value better.

Letting go of the fears of the ego has become and is a life-long goal of mine.

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The second is understanding that the more I view myself as the grain of sand. The smaller I realize I am, the larger my awareness becomes. In fact, my consciousness is expanding more and more, because of this very concept.

Recently the lesson of "Control" is very present in my life. I am learning to accept everything and everyone around me more and more each day. Even though I can tell you that it is a big challenge. (Coming from years as someone who has found leadership in some form for most of my professional life.)

In fact, so much so, I didn't even realize how wrapped up in the Ego of "Control", I really was.

Not until I started to notice it come up! And it arrived not with a whimper, but more like a BANG!

As I write this I have to wonder about this little grain of sand that I am. I find myself asking, 'How much "Control" do I really think I have, if I am only but a grain of sand?' Indeed, what if I learned to let go of "Control"? Would I be able to connect with the rest of the sandy beach? What other ego elements do I have to release?

In my understanding the "Ego" is all sourced, ultimately from fear. Or better put: 'It is the "Human" side of us.'

We are of two bodies, as I have come to realize. One of the Human kind and the other of the Spirit kind. The Human side of us is a limiting body that helps us to acquire the lessons we come here to experience and learn.

The Spirit body is the eternal being that has lived for a very long time and will continue to do so. Which also is connected, directly to the Creator. Over there, we can feel love not expressed as an emotion, but as a Force.

Rather like the forces of nature are to us in human form, the Force of Love is to our Spiritual Selves. It is inescapable. And one which we, in fact, accept. It is a knowing that goes beyond belief, or faith. It just is.

I guess the best way to wrap up this is the perception that the smaller I realize I am, the larger my consciousness becomes. It is the very opposite of what my ego believes.

BPM: When you were growing up, what style of music did you like singing to the most and why? **Michael:** When I was a child I was mostly influenced by what my parents were listening too which was country, some Beatles and a little classic rock. So I would sing anything that was being played at home until I found what I liked. I was also in choir, so I got a lot of practice singing church songs at the time. Mostly a mix of country music and classic rock.

BPM: So you have to tell us - How did you find yourself traveling to Ireland? **Michael:** The Irish Hotel Federation hosted interviews at my college looking to recruit new graduates to hire and bring to Ireland. I got the job and went. It was the first time I traveled outside of Canada that far and it was an amazing experience plus a bit of a culture shock. I also brought my guitar. It never leaves my side. I made a lot of friends playing music while I was there.

BPM: Does Irish music play a part in your influences when creating a new song? **Michael:** No it doesn't. To be honest Ireland is a beautiful warm place but I'm not a big fan of Irish music. It's fine in small doses for me but not much of an influence on my style of music.

BPM: Did you manage to write any songs while you were living in your van? **Michael:** Yes I did. I'm always writing. Melodies come first for me along with music. Lyrics are last thing to arrive. Yes living in a van is quite an experience so some songs were created in that moment of my life.

BPM: How did that time inspire you?

Michael: I chose to live in van because I was following my dream. However, I did talk too and met a lot of homeless people who shared their stories and I was amazed I what I learned and what inspired me. We go everyday complaining sometimes about the little things but meeting a homeless person and seeing their struggles. Inspiration found me in those moments. I have always been a risk taker and I knew I had to take a chance on me and my gift to see where it would lead. I found inspiration mostly in the people I met and their stories. I was struggling myself and I questioned myself many times as to why I chose to do what my heart desired and follow my true path of music. It wasn't easy but I found anew part of myself and that helped with inspiration.

BPM: When you were younger, working at those different jobs, did you feel back then that you were meant for a musical career?

If don't have patience, perseverance, ambition and goals then you won't get far. If your attitude is all ego. You won't get far! I found I made more fans by having a great attitude, by being thankful for the fans who come out and support you. Keep working on your craft and make sure your writing is maturing. Don't be afraid to collaborate. It helps open those creative juices! You must live it, Breath it and play hard! Hopefully your music gets to where it should be in time.



That's when I fell in love with it and have been producing ever since.

BPM: What are your influences?

Keana: My friends and family influence my work a lot, I draw from personal experiences with them all the time.

BPM: Why did you choose this particular genre your in?

Keana: Because dance music describes my personality really. It's fun, wild and it can make you feel free. The beat of a dance track just makes you feel alive, it can never bring you down.

BPM: What's your favourite DAW that you use?

Keana: Logic and Ableton. It's very good quality software, has more instruments than others, is clearer, and generally better sound quality.

BPM: We all learn from each other, your tracks are clean great on the ears what's your secret? Do you have any pro tips you have learned, you could pass on to us all?

Keana: My passion for producing is my secret really, I'm so determined and driven that I won't give up till I'm happy with a track. Even in my personal life, my friends and family could testify that if I want something done, I won't give up till it happens.

As far as tips go, it's kinda cliché but honestly just never give up if it's something you're passionate about. There can be a lot of potential hurdles and setbacks in the industry sometimes, but you have to push on and take everything in your stride. Also make yourself known, don't be afraid to put yourself out there in the world of social media, and make lots of noise about you and your music. It's all about the networking.

BPM: Where do your ideas for your next big song come from, where does it all begin?

Keana: I like to make the emotions I feel every day come alive in my music. I find it easy to go with the flow and let my mind and thoughts take over.

BPM: Who would you like to work with?

Keana: I'd love to work with David Guetta and Skrillex, because their music style is exactly what I'm all about, I'd love to mix their creativity and imagination with my own and see what the outcome would be.

Keana: So so so so so happy, because N-Dubz have genuinely always been my favourites, went to see Dappy at the O2 last year. I'd be so proud of myself, and it would give me much more confidence in myself.

BPM: Can you talk about a fan encounter that completely took you by surprise?

Keana: When I received the very first Facebook messages and tweets after people I'd never spoken to listened to my tracks and commented on how talented I was and how much they loved them. When you've never experienced that before and people enjoy something you've put time, effort and emotion into, it's such a good feeling.

BPM: What can we expect from you in 2016?



Matthew Meadows is a technology mashup artist operating on the fringes of the emerald city of Seattle.


A retired ballet dancer that became a programmer, he is better known by his nom de guerre Rango the Dog, his original You-Tube handle.

BPM: What age were you when you sensed you might be musically gifted?

Matthew: That's so generous I'm wondering if my evil robot put you up to this (you know the one). I was taught music in school but learned to play guitar on the porch. Don't read it well & rarely try but I do like to play.

BPM: What inspired you to the guitar, tell us how it all began?

Matthew: My sister left a classical guitar in her closet when she left for college. I started playing with it as a young teenager.

BPM: When did ballet develop as an interest and why?

Matthew: I read a magazine article about Edward Villella, a famous principle dancer at New York City Ballet. An image of him dancing Prodigal Son astonished me, and I wanted to be able to do that. To my skinny & clumsy he was like Spiderman.

BPM: You have worked alongside some big brand names, how did the passion for technology come

Matthew: Very lucky. Born at the right time in the right spot, growing up in Michigan when the first retail computers came out. It was a moral conundrum, take your paper route money to the arcade or save to buy a Commodore, Tandy or Atari. I wasn't the only one in the neighborhood, but I didn't know anybody else with a Timex Sinclair.

BPM: At the peak of your career who would you aspire to be as successful as, apart from Rango, a legend in his own right?

Matthew: Agree that guy's sketchy. But you have to define the terms of your own success & he's given himself a very limited set of parameters in order that can easily succeed: he wants to own Youtube.
